- 3) Demonstrate financial need as determined by current UM need analysis policies upon receipt of a processed current Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and CSS College Board Profile.

- Complete the current FAFSA and CSS Profile
- Provide a typed essay (min. 300 words) on how you meet the specified criteria
- Complete and submit this application with required documentation on or before August 1st.
